#### **Stations of the Cross**



#### Council Blood Drive April 12, 2014

Our Annual Council Blood Drive will be held at our council Hall on Saturday, April 12, 2014 from 10:00 AM until 2:00 PM. This year, we shall partner with Emerson Council to broaden our reach and have a more successful drive which equates to more donors and more blood.

We need one thing to make our drive successful..........YOU! YOU are needed to get the word out about the drive. YOU are needed to donate blood, if eligible. YOU are needed to bring your spouse, your relatives, your friends and neighbors and your aged 16 and over children to the drive.

Who is eligible to give blood? Most people who are between the ages or 16 and 75 who are in good health and weigh at least 110 pounds are eligible to donate. (Parental consent is required for those 16 years of age.) At age 76, the donor must provide a yearly letter from his/her private physician stating he/she is in good health and capable of donating a pint of blood.

Yes, we need you but your blood is needed by so many others. Here are a few facts about blood and donations.

- One pint of blood from a single donor can save three lives
- Every three seconds, someone in this country needs a lifesaving blood transfusion.
- About one in seven people in the hospital need blood.
- Blood products are perishable, requiring consistent and continuous donations.
- Blood is in constant demand to treat patients with traumatic injuries and illnesses such as cancer and hemophilia and for use during surgeries.

What do you get for giving blood? The satisfaction of knowing that your pint of blood may have saved a life.


